CITY OF ST. THOMAS BY-LAW 162 - 2020

A by-law to amend By-law 56-2011, being a by-law requiring fencing of privately owned outdoor swimming pools.

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of St. Thomas may review its bylaws from time to time;

AND WHEREAS section 10(2) of the Municipal Act permits a municipality to pass by-laws respecting structures, including fences and to pass by-laws respecting the health and safety and well being of persons;

AND WHEREAS Section 391 of The Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, provides authority for municipalities to pass by-laws imposing fees and charges on any class of persons for services or activities provided or done by or on behalf of it;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF ST. THOMAS ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) That By-Law 56-2011 be amended by deleting the definition 1.(j) "Inspector" and the following definition be enacted in its place:
 - j) "Inspector" shall mean the person appointed by City Council to such position pursuant to the *Building Code Act* as:
 - i. a building inspector, or
 - ii. a property standards officer;
- (2) That By-Law 56-2011 be amended by adding the phrase "with a lockable lid" after the word "pool" in the definition of "hydro massage pool" in item 1.(p)(ix).

This By-law shall come into full force and effect on the day of passing of the enabling by-law, being the last date listed below.

Read a first and second time this 14th day of December, 2020.

Read a third time and finally passed this 14th day of December, 2020.
