Animal Shelter Process

- 1) -We don't accept puppies under 6 months, they go directly to ABCR
 - -We don't accept kittens under 2 months, they go to Animal Aide
 - -Wildlife is not accepted at the shelter. The city only picks up wildlife on city property.
 - -Animals could be found by a citizen, brought in by staff, by police or OSPCA
 - -Need to check if the animal is from outside of St. Thomas, as the animal may need to be taken to that Municipality
- 2) -Medical attention is given to animals that come in if they are in immediate distress as required under the pounds act. However if an owner comes forward to claim their animal and we have treated, the owner is responsible to pay all cost inquired by the pound for anything vet recommends, according to the pounds act.
 - -If tagged the owner is called
 - -If untagged the animal is kept at the shelter
 - -The shelter checks media outlets to see if animals have been posted as missing and will contact owner. The shelter has a lost report list as well that is kept up to date and if an animal comes into the pound the list is always referred to.
 - -Animals surrendered or past the stray period are placed up for adoption on Petfinders.
- 3) -During the 4 day stray period nothing medical is done to the animals unless in immediate distress. Flea treatment and worming treatment is given to all cats that come in, but dogs wait until after stray period to have anything for fleas and worming.
 - -Lost animals are not posted. Owners must contact the shelter to inquire if there animal is there and provide a description and photo.
- 4) -Rescue groups are contacted on the 5th day if that animal needs to be rescued from the shelter. There is a wait list of people looking for dogs or cats, if the animal matches what someone is looking for we contact them, give them an opportunity to come and meet the animal before reaching out to a rescue group. Finding a healthy animal an appropriate home is our shared goal. If we do not need to take up space in the rescue and can get the animals into a home we try that avenue first.
- 5) -The shelter does have a list of potential adopters as well as prefilled out application for people who would like to do so.
- 6) -The adoption fee includes the animal being fixed(spayed or neutered) flea treatment and worming as well as a license.
- 7) -All dogs are checked for tags as well as cats if brought into the shelter. Notice are send out at the annual and a reminder is also sent out if they haven't picked up a tag vet.
 - -Bylaw officers do check for tags on all animal bylaw calls.

Recommendation:

THAT: The Select Committee for Animal Welfare recommends that capital funding of \$400,000 set aside for Animal Shelter renovation be used towards the building of a new animal shelter.

Background:

The Select Committee for Animal Welfare appreciates Council recognition of concerns relating to the existing Animal Shelter facility on Burwell Road.

Due to its age, design, and location, the Select Committee feels that money would be better spent on a new building, rather than to renovate the existing building.

Some of the concerns the Committee has discussed include:

- Access to the location and onsite accessibility
- Limitations on parking and outdoor space for animals
- Size of indoor spaces and cages
- Lack of quarantine area and place for showing animals to prospective adopters

We would be pleased to have further discussion with Council and administration on a proposal to erect a new building in the future that is specifically designed to accommodate an animal shelter.

Financial Impact:

Additional funds would be required for construction of a new building and could include fundraising efforts.
