

Malahide is home to an estimated **2,015 children age 0-12**.

The median age of the population is 35.6 years, which is **lower than the median age of Elgin County**, and the provincial median of 41.3.

An estimated 85 persons, or **1% of the population** in Malahide report **Aboriginal identity**.

16% of persons in Malahide **speak a non-official language** most often at home. The majority of those, an estimated 1,385 persons, reported speaking German or Germanic languages not otherwise indicated.





Child Development at School Entry: Early Development Instrument (EDI)

The EDI is a 103-item questionnaire completed by kindergarten teachers that measures children's ability to meet age appropriate developmental expectations in five general domains. Research has shown that early vulnerability predicts a child's lifelong health, learning and behaviour.

There have been four complete cycles of the EDI in Ontario: Cycle I (2005/06), Cycle II (2008/09), Cycle III (2011/2012), Cycle IV (2014/15). Data for Cycle V of the EDI was collected in Spring 2018.



Children vulnerable by domain, Cycles I-V, Elgin County (%)





Household income and financial security

Is the living wage calculated for St. Thomas & Elgin county in 2018/2019. This is the hourly rate needed for two income earners, working 35 hours per week year round to support a family of four with two children aged 3 and 7. This is **equivalent to a before-tax income of \$60,315 per family.**

In Malahide, the median total income of families is \$84,128 and the average total income of families is \$94,663, above both the median and average income for Elgin County.

Large disparities between median and average income indicate greater income inequality within a population.


Malahide has **the highest prevalence (27.2%) of children ages 0-5 living in low income** in Elgin County. The rate is higher than both the prevalence for Ontario (19.8%) and Elgin County (21.4%) overall.
