


LICENSED SPACES PROFILE





Minimum Yearly Totals





AVERAGE NUMBER OF CHILDREN RECEIVING FEE SUBSIDY MONTHLY





REASONS FAMILIES RECEIVING SUBSIDY ARE ACCESSING CHILD CARE




Reasons for receiving fee subsidy as categorized by OCCMS.







