Permit Applications

St. Thomas Kinsmen Easter Egg Hunt (Drive Thru) - April 3, 2021

Mr. Paul Trittler, St. Thomas Kinsmen provided an overview of the event and advised that prepackaged bags of chocolate would be handed out to children.

The members discussed the traffic flow through the park and where the bags would be handed out.

Mayor Preston suggested that the Kinsmen contact the St. Thomas Police Service to request assistance with traffic and that if they are unable to assist, another group capable of assisting would need to be designated.

A. Jefferson asked that the chocolate be given out near the main Dance Pavilion to ensure that residents continue to have access to the rest of the park.

T. Bridge asked that an event volunteer be stationed at the Emslie Field gates should emergency access to the park be needed.

The members discussed the enforcement plan relating to masking and people staying in their vehicles.

THAT: The Special Events Committee supports the permit for the St. Thomas Kinsmen Easter Egg Hunt Drive Thru event to be held on April 3, 2021; and further,

THAT: Southwestern Public Health be contacted regarding a plan for reducing the spread of COVID-19 at the event; including the following requirements:

- 1. Only members of the same household can be in a vehicle together,
- 2. Everyone in the vehicle must wear a mask when the windows are open,
- 3. Individuals handing out candy must wear a mask and eye protection and use tongs for handing out the candy,
- 4. Hand sanitizer must be available for individuals handing out candy, and
- 5. An enforcement plan be provided relating to the gathering limit and physical distancing requirement for any individuals who attend the event without a vehicle; and further

THAT: The St. Thomas Police Department be contracted regarding traffic control for the event; and further,

THAT: All other necessary requirements be fulfilled to the satisfaction of the Corporation of the City of St. Thomas; and further,

THAT: Should the local situation relating to COVID-19 require, the event may be cancelled with little notice.
