Good afternoon!

Stage 1: Is now open for traffic! Trees have been planted as well as new plantings in the planter boxes. Street lighting is the last major item to be completed and should be completed by mid-July. During the installation of the lights some parking bays will need to be occupied and you may see some traffic control measures like 1-way flagging.

Stage 2: Is now underway, asphalt pulverization and removals have started and will continue into next week. Next week construction fencing will be put up so they start can start to excavate for the sanitary sewer replacements.

### Road Closures and Access:

- Stage 2: Talbot St. from City Hall to Ross Street is now closed to through traffic, please follow the posted detour. On street parking within the construction zone is **not** permitted
- Stage 1: Talbot St. from Mary St to Princess Ave. is now reopened to through traffic, on street parking will resume were possible, construction activity and parking layby closures will be done as required to finish Stage 1.
- Front Door access may be interrupted periodically during construction, advance notification will be provided prior to any disruption
