Happy Friday, I hope everyone has had a good week and has a great weekend! Some updates on the project below.

Stage 2: The watermain has now been installed and pressure testing has been completed, next week they will start doing chlorination and testing of the new watermain. Once the tests come back, they will begin hooking up each building to the new watermain. Water disruptions will be communicated by the contractor in advance of any shutdowns. Stage 1: The last few items of work have been subject to some delays. The street lighting and the remaining brick work will be completed as soon as the materials get to site.

- Watermain testing
- Install Storm Catch basins
- Building up the roadway

- Mainline Watermain

Road Closures and Access:

- Stage 2: Talbot St. from City Hall to Ross Street is now closed to through traffic, please follow the posted detour. On street parking within the construction zone is **not** permitted
- Stage 1: Talbot St. from Mary St to Mondamin St. is now reopened to through traffic, on street parking will resume where possible, construction activity and parking layby closures will be done as required to finish Stage 1.
- Front Door access may be interrupted periodically during construction, advance notification will be provided prior to any disruption
