The City Clerk read a letter dated August 21, 2006 that had been received from Mr. Brian Worrad, Solicitor, representing Alma Heritage Estates Corporation.

Mrs. Jill Zubick was in attendance and questioned why a firm offer had not been presented, whether Mr. Gunn knew how much it would cost to mothball the building, and if a business case had been seen.

Mrs. Zubick was concerned that the proposed design charette that had been planned would not take place should Council vote against the demolition permit tonight.

The members thanked Mr. Gunn for his information and for identifying the fact that a group of individuals is willing to restore Alma College.
