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Affordable Housing Program Recommended Projects - Appendix "D"

The members commended the efforts of M.P.P. Steve Peters and of Ontario Works staff for the work that had been done to develop the affordable housing projects.

The Director, Ontario Works informed the members that 51 housing units were being proposed as a result of the creative use of the funds available. Further she stated that she expected that some of the projects would be under construction by March.

The members inquired about the potential for the City to offer additional financial concessions in the provision of affordable housing units.

The Director, Ontario Works stated that any financial concessions would reflect upon the actual amount of funds that a project would receive from the affordable housing allocation in that the value of any financial concessions could be deducted from the funding allocation to individual projects. Further she stated that any financial concessions made by the City would allow more housing units to be developed due to the fact that the funding dollars could go further. Additionally she stated that the Province would view any financial concessions provided by the City favourably.

THAT: Council approves the following projects for total funding of \$3,500,000 toward the construction of 51 new units of affordable housing in St. Thomas and Elgin County under the Canada-Ontario Affordable Housing Program (AHP), Rental & Supportive component:

- 1. AHP funding in the amount of \$1,504,108 toward the construction of a new 23-unit apartment building at 25 Scott Street in St. Thomas to be developed by Novi Construction Limited,
- 2. AHP funding in the amount of \$828,000 toward the construction of a new 12-unit apartment building at 78 Steele Street in St. Thomas to be developed by Walter Ostojic & Sons Ltd., and
- 3. AHP funding in the amount of \$1,167,892 toward the construction of a new 16-unit seniors' apartment building in West Lorne in accordance with a proposal submitted by West Lorne Heritage Homes; and further,

THAT: Council approves a proposal submitted by Dutton & District Lions Non-Profit Housing for 30 units or \$2,100,000 in AHP funding for a new seniors' apartment building in Dutton, conditional on the receipt of additional AHP Rental & Supportive funding from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing; and further,

THAT: Council instructs staff to forward these recommended project proposals to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing for Ministerial approval; and further,

THAT: Council grants permission to staff to reallocate the level of AHP funding among these projects, as required, in the event that Council approves additional financial concessions for any project in the City of St. Thomas; and further,

THAT: Council approves the submission of a request to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing for an additional AHP Rental & Supportive allocation of 30 units or \$2,100,000 in funding toward the construction of a new 30-unit seniors' apartment building in Dutton in accordance with a proposal submitted by Dutton & District Lions Non-Profit Housing; and further,
