Year End Fire Report 2006 - Appendix "H"

The Fire Chief stated that the value of fire loss in 2006 was much lower than in 2005.

The members inquired about the status of the new fire pumper truck that is on order and if a member of the Fire Department would be going to the manufacturer to inspect the truck.

The Fire Chief stated that there would be a pre-build meeting in St. Thomas with representatives of the manufacturer and that someone from the Fire Department would be going to Florida to inspect the fire pumper truck at the manufacturing plant. Further, he stated that a representative from the manufacturing plant would be delivering the fire pumper truck to St. Thomas.
